One Man's Affection for Early-Blooming Species Rhododendrons and Their Captivating Companion Plants

Our speaker for the April meeting is Peter Kendall. Peter will present a slide show on rhododendron species that extend the growing season by coming into bloom earlier than you might expect, and their companion plants. An added bonus is Peter's knowledge of the botanical names of all of those plants.

Peter Kendall is a longtime member of the American Rhododendron Society and an accomplished photographer, writer and speaker. He received the Bronze Medal in 1992, which is the highest honor an A.R.S. chapter can bestow on a Chapter member.

As you can tell from the title, Peter has a great affection for plants. If you ever have the opportunity to visit his garden in person, I highly recommend taking him up on that offer. Peter's garden is perfectly landscaped - a photographer's dream! It is filled with species rhododendrons, their companion plants, and many additional trees and other plants. There are many "touches", such as stepping stones and carefully designed paths. Peter also has a new garden building that is both functional and attractive.

Peter was a landscaper in the Portland metro area for over 30 years and is now "retired", which means he has had more time to devote to perfecting his own garden and perfecting it is what he has done. Peter is amazing to watch pruning trees - with a chainsaw!

Peter is well-known as a haiku artist and has had 3 books of his poems published to date. His haiku is to be found in our Portland Chapter monthly newsletter, the Japanese Garden newsletter and the international A.R.S. Journal. In addition, Peter has had articles published in the A.R.S. Journal for over 20 years. Other publications that have carried his writing are Pacific Horticulture magazine and the Berry Garden Newsletter.

A Species to Treasure: *Rhododendron mallotum*

It is hard to pass by a plant of *R. mallotum* without noticing its dark green foliage accented by its woolly, brownish-red indumentum. The combination of the deep green on the top sides and the striking indumentum underneath begs you to take a second look. Like frosting on a cake, the flowers are beautiful, also. They form full trusses of crimson, scarlet or cherry-red.

Here is more about *R. mallotum*:

Classification: Section: Hymenanthes Subsection: Neriiflora. *R. mallotum* is so distinct from the rest of the Neriiflora that it is one most easily recognizable of all the species in the subsection.

It is an elepidote, meaning that its leaves do not have scales.

Leaves: very thick and stiff, obovate, retained for 1 to 3 years, dark green on top and covered with a dense, woolly cinnamon-brown indumentum on the undersides.

Flowers: usually crimson, sometimes scarlet or cherry-red in trusses of up to 20 corollas; blooms late March to early April.

Placement in your garden: needs protection from frost because of its early blooms.

Its natural origin is NE Upper Myanmar and Western Yunnan at 11,000 to 12,000 feet.

Hardiness: + 10 degrees F.
