Directions to Mike and Maria's home 42125 SE Kleinsmith Rd. Sandy, Oregon

From the last signal light in the City of Sandy, take U.S. 26 east out of town, for 2 miles.

Exit right onto Firwood Road. The landmark at this exit is a gas station/store combination called 'Shorty's'. Go 3/4 of a mile on Firwood Road, and then turn right at the 4-way intersection at the top of the hill. There is a Dover Nursery sign on a utility pole, pointing to the right, at this intersection. There is also a Dover Community Church sign, pointing to the right, at this intersection. This right turn will keep you on Firwood Road.

Go 2 1/2 miles further on Firwood Road until you get to a 4-way stop at the intersection of Wildcat Mountain Drive and Firwood Road. Cross over Wildcat Mountain Drive and take the middle road which is Kleinsmith Road. It goes slightly to the left and down the hill. There is also a sign pointing to Dover Nursery at this intersection. Our home and nursery is 8/10ths of a mile more on Kleinsmith Road, on the left side, across from the Dover Community Church. **503-668-3522**

Time to Picnic, Time to Party: Sunday, June 29th, at the Home of Ali and Gloria Sarlak

All ARS members in District 4 are invited to join us for our annual June picnic at the home of Ali and Gloria Sarlak in Corvallis. Come about noon for a walk around the lovely garden, filled with roses, perennials, sculptures, shady nooks, a rock garden - vignettes that show Ali's artistry in gardening.

The potluck picnic will begin at 1:00 pm. Please bring a dish to share - side dish, salad or dessert - to serve 10-12 people. Don't forget a serving utensil. Also, please bring your own dishes, silverware, napkins and your beverage of choice. For the main dish, Ali will be grilling salmon supplied by the Chapter, but please feel free to bring an alternate main dish, if you like. Ali has a number of chairs and tables but you might bring a favorite lawn chair.

As we have traditionally done at our June picnic, there will be a plant exchange (entirely optional) so feel free to bring a nicely potted plant to exchange for a different one. Please choose a rhododendron, azalea or companion plant that would make a nice addition to a garden - it's a nice way to add a new plant to your garden.

The Sarlaks live at 4150 NE Fair Acres St. which is on the northeast side of Corvallis and is easy to find. From Eugene, you can drive to Corvallis on HWY 99 and 99W, or on I-5, or on beautiful Peoria Road, which goes from HWY 99E on the north side of Harrisburg to Hwy 34 just east of Corvallis.

No matter which way you get to Corvallis, you will want to look for signs for Hwy 20 toward Albany. This will be 2nd Street in Corvallis. If you are coming into Corvallis on Hwy 34, cross the Willamette River and turn right onto Hwy 20. From the bridge, drive 3.2 miles north to Asbahr Ave. Turn right on NE Asbahr for 495 feet to Fair Acres Street. Turn right and the Sarlak home is the first house on the right.

If you get lost, their 'phone number is: 541-758-9190. There is room for 4 cars in the driveway for our members who need to park the closest. There is room for 7 or 8 cars along Fair Acres off of Asbahr Ave.

A Remarkable Species: *Rhododendron insigne*

Along about the second week in May, *Rhododendron insigne* shows off its pink and white flowers with pink stripes decorating the outside of each corolla. The foliage is handsome, also, with the stiff dark green leaves framing the flowers. The tawny indumentum is so plastered-on that it reminds you of skin and its coppery sheen is quite attractive.

Here is more about *R. insigne*:

Classification: *Section: Hymenanthes Subsection: Argyrophylla*

Natural origin: Apparently only grows on Wa Shan where it may be extinct, in Central Sichuan at 7,000 to 10,000 feet elevation in woodlands. May have been found recently in N.E. Yunnan and South Sichuan.

It is an elepidote, meaning it has no scales on its leaves.

Flowers: The bell-shaped corollas range in color from light pink to deep pink with distinctive deeper pink stripes on each lobe. Blooms in mid-May and later.

Leaves: The word “*insigne*” means remarkable and the foliage is certainly worthy of that epithet. The tops of the thick leaves are shiny and dark green. They feel stiff and rigid. The undersides of the lance-shaped leaves are tightly covered with a shiny, coppery indumentum.

Height and structure: 3 feet in 10 years and grows slowly in the sun.

Hardiness: 0 degrees F.

Placement in your garden: *R. insigne* grows best in sun to show off its compact form. It gets leggy in the shade.
