"Photos and Impressions of a Kyoto Garden Tour in Autumn"

In November of 2013, four landscape designers from Oregon went on a garden tour of Kyoto, Japan together. They will present their photographs and impressions of the distinctive gardens they visited. Our speakers will be landscape designers Barbara Hilty, Barbara Simon, Marion McNew and Alyse Lansing.

Barbara Hilty has owned and operated Barbara Hilty Landscape Design, LLC since 1982. She is an APLD certified professional landscape designer. She will open the program with an introduction to Kyoto and an overview of its garden development.

Marion McNew (APLD) owns Mount Hood Gardens, Inc. in Hood River, Oregon. Mount Hood Gardens has created more than 250 private and commercial gardens and parks in the mid-Columbia region. She will speak on Japanese garden design techniques.

Barbara Simon (APLD) has operated her own landscape design practice since 2002 and is a member of the Friends of Crystal Springs Rhododendron Garden. She will take us through several of Kyoto's fine gardens.

Alyse Lansing was formerly a freelance writer and photographer. She obtained her landscape design certification in 2002 and has operated her own design firm since. She is also currently staff designer for Joy Creek Nursery. Alyse will close the program with a discussion of the maintenance of Japanese gardens.

Following the program, we will hold our annual auction of species rhododendrons for the benefit of the Chapter. Please bring plants to donate for the auction and don't forget to bring your checkbook!

Chapter Meeting Highlights from September 18th, 2014

Our first meeting of the fall season was a great success, with attendance estimated at 50 people, A.R.S. members, their guests, and visitors, who came to hear a wonderful program. They also found delicious, homemade treats in abundance, our annual cuttings exchange and a fun raffle, overseen by E. White Smith.

Our speaker was Don W. Hyatt and his program was titled “America’s Rhododendron Treasures - Native Rhododendrons and Azaleas.” Mr. Hyatt began with the rhododendrons and one azalea native to the Western U.S. and then took up the more numerous species native to the Eastern U.S. His excellent photographs of all the different species included many of the habitats they occupy. In his talk, Mr. Hyatt discussed the present status of our native species and the ongoing efforts to protect and preserve existing populations. He was a source of interesting facts about both the plants and their habitats, for example, the majority of native deciduous azaleas are very fragrant, and can often be detected by their fragrance before they are sighted. Habitat loss is a constant concern, with many azalea species found only in very limited areas.

Dennis O’Malley, our Chapter Vice-President, adds: “ We would like to thank all of you who attended or helped publicize our September 18th program with Don Hyatt, which was delightful in every way. It was good to see so many visitors and new faces. Our thanks also to our Board for creating and funding the Speaker’s Committee, and to Dave Collier and Mike Stewart for their efforts in making it all happen.”

The cuttings exchange brought a fine offering of mostly hardy rhododendrons and a few vireyas. Now to see what roots!

Finally, our kitchen crew and the cooks and bakers among our members deserve our thanks - we enjoyed a really delicious selection of homemade treats to tempt us.

CVRS Southwest England Garden Tour May 14-25, 2015

The Cowichan Valley Rhododendron Society, of British Columbia, Canada, has organized an 11-day tour to the U.K. in May of 2015, commencing just a few days after the 70th Anniversary ARS Convention in British Columbia next May.

The list of historic sites and world-class gardens includes Kew Botanic Garden, RHS Wisley, RHS Rosemoor, Hidcote Manor gardens, Blenheim Castle and Gardens, travelling through Devon and Cornwall all the way to Land's End, with stops at Stonehenge and onward to Oxford for the combined purposes of garden visits, sightseeing and shopping. Subject to the ups and downs of the foreign exchange markets, the cost of the tour is estimated at \$3,000.00 Canadian, exclusive of airfare, for double room and single accommodation for approximately \$700.00 Canadian more. Depending on interest, there may be a group-rate flight booking available which could reduce airfare cost.

A Joy to Behold in Spring: Rhododendron ‘Songbird’

There is so much hyperbole surrounding the gorgeous yellow and orange rhododendrons that are the newer hybrids today. They attract our attention even if their plant structure is not what it should be. So, this article is dedicated to a dwarf rhododendron that has been around for a long time and deserves some of our appreciation. Rhododendron ‘Songbird’ has deep green, shiny little leaves that cover the twiggy branches. Its compact form is decorated with bright purple blue flowers that seem to glow.

Here are more descriptions about R. ‘Songbird’:

It is a lepidote, which means it has scales on the undersides of its leaves.

The cross is: (R. russatum x R. ‘Blue Tit’)

The hybridizer is Horlick, who made the cross in 1954.

The clustered corollas are bright purple blue and the bloom time is April.

The very small leaves are shiny and dark green.

Depending on its placement in your garden, its height should be around 3 feet in 10 years.

Hardiness: -5 degrees F. (or colder)
