In Memory of Kathy Van Veen

As I am sure most of you know from our prior email to the membership, our dear friend, mentor and colleague Kathy Van Veen passed away on Wednesday, April 26, 2017 at 8:30 pm. I understand that she was resting peacefully at home, and was very appreciative of all of the care and support she received, including the visits, meals, cards and photos she received from all of you.

It is difficult to write anything about Kathy that does her justice. She was, of course, a world-renowned expert at propagating rhododendrons. She assisted hybridizers, nurseries, and hobbyists from all over the country and indeed all over the world in propagating their favorite varieties and their new introductions. Like her father Ted Van Veen before her, Kathy in 2011 received the ARS Gold Medal, the highest award given by the ARS to individuals for their extraordinary service at the national and international level. Her citation for the Gold Medal memorably described her skill at propagating rhododendron cuttings as reaching the level where she could get a lead pencil to form roots.

Kathy was and is irreplaceable. The time and energy that Kathy gave to the Portland Chapter of the ARS and to the Crystal Springs Rhododendron Garden cannot be measured. She administered and wrote newsletters for the Friends of Crystal Springs. She handled our bank deposits, wrote our checks, fielded our phone calls, received our mail and edited our newsletter. Even we did not know or understand all the things she did for us until she became ill last fall. When I took office last fall, the question was constantly asked: "Who takes care of this?" The answer was almost always "Kathy Van Veen". It now takes five or ten of us to do all of the things Kathy used to do. (All of the people who have stepped up to try and fill the void deserve our thanks and gratitude.)

On a more personal note, Kathy Van Veen is the reason that I am a member of the ARS and the Portland Chapter. Some years ago I wandered into Van Veen Nursery on a Saturday morning looking for a particular deciduous azalea. Kathy and I talked for over two hours. It was immediately apparent that Kathy was someone special, one of a kind. Her passion for rhododendrons and for the three-generation history of her nursery was contagious and inspiring. I promptly became a member and have been ever since. So I have Kathy to thank personally not only for all she gave, but for all the friendship and fellowship I have shared in the Chapter over the years since then.

I can only say that we will miss her and remember her.

There will be a memorial service for Kathy at St. Ignatius Catholic Church, located (near the nursery) at 3400 S.E. 43rd Avenue, Portland, Oregon, on Thursday, May 11, 2017 at 10:00 am. I understand that it will include an opportunity to share your own memories of Kathy.

Wonderful Hybrids from Ben Lancaster: R. 'Bluette', R. 'Snow Lady', R. 'Vulcan's Flame' and R. 'Yaku Sunrise'

Do you know that Ben Lancaster was a Charter Member of the American Rhododendron Society? Ben and his wife, Rose, lived in Camas, Washington and eventually their granddaughter, Ellen, joined the Portland Chapter in 2007. Occasionally, Ellen attends our events. Ben caught a case of "rhododendronitis" in about 1937 while recovering from an accident, and for 33 years after that, his attention was focused on the genus. He created at least 36 hybrids and just possibly you may have a Lancaster hybrid in your garden. Ben based his hybridizing on planning the objectives of each cross. He used parents that have positive attributes such as cold and heat tolerance, good form, good foliage and rooting ability. Among his hybrids, you will see his use of *R. williamsianum* and *R. yakushmanum* that produced excellent garden sized plants. Hybridizing to get late bloomers, using the fragrance of *R. occidentale* and creating large-leaf hybrids with *R. macabeum* were other goals that intrigued Ben Lancaster.

Here are some details about 'Bluette', 'Snow Lady', 'Vulcan's Flame' and 'Yaku Sunrise':

'Bluette' (*R. augustinii* x *R. impeditum*) a lepidote dwarf about 3 feet high in 10 years; light blue trusses; leaves are medium green on dense, interwoven branches; hardiness of -5 degrees F.; try filtered sun for best performance.

(Lancaster, 1958)

'Snow Lady' (*R. leucaspis* x *R. ciliatum*) a lepidote growing to about 30 inches in 10 years; snow white trusses; leaves are medium green and covered with noticeable hairs; hardiness of -5 degrees F. But you should plant it where there is protection from frost to save the early blooms.

(Lancaster, 1958) P.A., 1955

'Vulcan's Flame' (*R. griersonianum* x 'Mars') This is the reverse cross of 'Vulcan'. Ben found merit in making reverse crosses because the seed parent is important in creating plants with good form and growth habit. Glowing red trusses; an elepidote growing to about 5 feet in 10 years; dark green pointed leaves with red stems; hardiness of -15 degrees F.; blooms in late May into June.

(Lancaster before 1955)

'Yaku Sunrise' ('Vulcan's Flame' x *R. yakushmanum* 'Koichiro Wada') an elepidote growing to about 3 feet tall and wide in 10 years; pink with a subtle blend of peach and deeper pink on the outside of the petals; deep green leaves are recurved slightly; hardiness of -10 degrees F.; blooms in May.

Highlights of the April Meeting

Our April meeting was quite busy: we held our annual meeting and voted in a slate of new board members, listened to an interesting and informative speaker and held our annual auction of rhododendron hybrids, all in just a few evening hours on Thursday, April 20th, 2017.

Our speaker was Ned Brockenbrough, and his program was entitled “Adventures in Hybridizing”. You might have noticed that Ned has a different philosophy with regard to the use of colchicine to induce polyploidy in rhododendron hybrids, compared with our March speaker, Richard Murcott, who has moved away from using colchicine in his breeding program. Another clear difference is their geographic location: Richard Murcott lives in East Norwich, New York, and Ned Brockenbrough lives in Seattle, Washington. Both have 50 years or more of experience hybridizing and growing rhododendrons, with the goal of creating superior plants for their environment. Here again, science applied to horticulture, with beautiful results. For those of us on the west coast of the country, Ned’s hybrids R. ‘Paprika Spice’ and the R. ‘Horizon’ Series are very popular. And who knew that our much-loved early red, R. ‘Taurus’ is hardy enough to survive on the east coast of the country? (Richard Murcott).

Speaking of beautiful results, our auction of hybrid rhododendrons was as lively as ever, with both the digital projector and photographs used to show us the plants in bloom, a clear case of technology in the service of “rhododendronitis”.

Our program and speakers committee deserves a big “Thank you!” for your efforts on our behalf and a really makes-you-think series of speakers.

Directions to Mike and Maria's home 42125 SE Kleinsmith Rd. Sandy, Oregon

From the last signal light in the city of Sandy, take U.S. 26 east out of town, for 2 miles.

Exit right onto Firwood Road. The landmark at this exit is a gas station/store combination called Shorty's. Go 3/4 of a mile on Firwood Road, and then turn right at the 4-way intersection at the top of the hill. There is a Dover Nursery sign on a utility pole pointing right at this intersection. There is also a Dover Community Church sign pointing right at this intersection. This right turn will keep you on Firwood Road.

Go 2 1/2 miles further on Firwood Road until you get to a 4-way stop at the intersection of Wildcat Mountain Drive and Firwood Road. Cross over Wildcat Mountain Drive and take the middle road which is Kleinsmith Road. It goes slightly to the left and down the hill. There is also a sign pointing to the Dover Nursery at this intersection. Our home and nursery is 8 tenths of a mile more on Kleinsmith Rd., on the left side, across from the Dover Community Church.
