COTTINGS:

IS THERE A CLONE IN YOUR FUTURE?



The most practical way of increasing the number of rhododendrons (or even non-rhododendron vegetative matter) is via cuttings. Knowledge of the details of this process greatly increases the success rate for rooting cuttings. This is a procedure that can be followed by anyone that has a garden where the resulting plants can find a home or has friends who have the space for more rhody plantings.

There will be a CUTTING EXCHANGE following the meeting. If you have some special rhododendrons that you would like to give to someone else, bring 2 or 3 cuttings in a sandwich bag (or several sandwich bags full of cuttings) and exchange them for someone

else's cuttings. Put into practice what you learn in tonight's informative meeting.

Mike Stewart owns Dover Nursery, specializing in rhododendrons, most of which are produced from cuttings. Mike is the Past President of the American Rhododendron Society.
