Colorful Fall Foliage in Our Gardens

I potted up a rooted layer of *Rhododendron mucronulatum* and parked it in a group of rhodies in my backyard for protection. For the past few weeks, I've been enjoying a bright splash of color in the midst of the evergreen rhodies as the deciduous *R. mucronulatum* puts on a display of green, yellow, orange and red leaves. I like the effect so much I'm thinking of planting it right where it is, and it's got me to thinking about other unplanned fall 'color spots' that showed up this year. In terms of smaller shrubs, *Enkianthus* have put on a show, primarily bright yellow. Larger but equally colorful are *Hamamelis*, which follow up with fragrant yellow, orange or red flowers after leaf-fall. All are mixed in with evergreen rhododendrons and seem to be at the right scale compared to the plants around them. Gardening by accident? What's been a good autumn foliage plant in your garden?

November Meeting Highlights

Our speaker for the November meeting was Harold Greer, who attended with his wife, Nancy. They are the owners and operators of Greer Gardens in Eugene, Oregon, which for decades has been a leading source for rhododendrons and other rare and unusual plants, known throughout the world. Mr. Greer is the author of the indispensable *Greer's Guidebook to Available Rhododendrons* and co-author with Homer Salley of *Rhododendron Hybrids*. He is the recipient of the Gold Medal award of the American Rhododendron Society and has served as the International President of the ARS. We were lucky to be able to present such a nationally and internationally recognized authority and sought-after speaker.

In the course of the evening we learned that Mr. Greer hybridized R. 'Trude Webster' in 1955 when he was 10 years old and that the Greer Gardens business was placed in his name when he was only 12 years old. The Rhododendron Species Foundation and Botanical Garden celebrated its 50th anniversary earlier this year, and that was Mr. Greer's topic. At age 19, Mr. Greer was present at the inception of the RSF as recording secretary at the meeting at which the RSF was founded. He was a key participant and a keen observer of that 50-year history.

For his program, Mr. Greer gathered historical photographs of the founders and subsequent leaders of the Rhododendron Species Foundation, telling the story of its founding in high hopes and its precarious existence over the early years, up to its emergence as a mature and well-established organization. Mixed in were his personal memories of the events in which he participated and the people he knew so well during those decades. Pictures of Steve Hootman and Dennis Bottemiller in their early years at the RSF were another entertaining highlight.

It was a warm program of important memories and events, which was graciously presented and warmly received. Our thanks to Harold and Nancy for visiting us again.

Outstanding Foliage and Elegant Blooms: *Rhododendron pachysanthum*

Rhododendron pachysanthum catches your eye when you walk near it and it stands out from other plants at a distance, also. The beautiful combination of the silvery tomentum on the tops of the leaves and the thick, tan indumentum on the undersides of the leaves makes this species one of the most desirable rhododendrons in the world.

Here is more information about *R. pachysanthum*:

Classification: it belongs to Subsection Maculifera

Distribution in the wild: Central Taiwan, at 10,000 - 10,500 feet in elevation, in full exposure above the treeline.

Structure: compact and dense in the sun, becoming somewhat less compact with age.

Flowers: white to pale pink and usually spotted. Expect to wait a few years for blooms.

Leaves: The foliage provides continual beauty throughout the year. The persistent silvery tomentum on the tops of the leaves and the thick, tan indumentum on the undersides of the leaves make a distinctive combination.

Height: 3 feet tall and wide in 10 years.

Hardiness: -5 degrees F.
